- Focus is on workstreams, feasibility of events, interim conditions and budgeting.
- Workstreams: in the immediate: facilities ready, stock show ready, CSU ready. Interim: events ready, procurements etc.
- Discussed phases of operations planning. Discussed interim condition – post stock show 2022 and before all assets are complete.
- Booking in 2022 we believe it is feasible to book SYEC and yards. Exploring cost of interim operating conditions.
- Interim Condition Assumptions. 2 years long, livestock will be done in 2024, events are possible, procurements will need to happen. Long term plan is to a third party contract vs building, mission oriented events. Coordination with CSU and WSSA
- Interim Condition Goals: launching brand, leading with mission, starting to book events, defray fixed cost, leveraging WSSA, AV etc.
- Interim Condition next steps.
- Working with a group that is lining us to expertise.
- We are working toward a budget to support our activity.
- Long term procurements what is the appropriate phasing for the procurements.
- Schedule for procurement is in process.
- Next steps continue to meet with Tier 1+, develop a draft budget for finance and final approval by board.

Paul: I am supportive of the process. I have put forward that Stock Show is probably cheapest option but he is looking other options and I support that.

Kelly: I am supportive of all the work. Appreciate all the work of staff.

Robb: the exploratory process is important and we don't want to get us into something too soon so we can adapt in the future.

John: Expressed appreciation for everyone's work.
