Memorandum of Understanding Phase 1 – Plan Development

DRAFT

City and County of Denver Mayor's Office of the National Western Center 201 W. Colfax Avenue, 9th Floor Denver, CO 80202

Attention: Barbara Frommell, Director of Strategic Partnerships

Congratulations on being selected to participate in Xcel Energy's Partners in Energy program. This program is designed to provide the National Western Center Campus (NWC) with the tools and resources necessary to develop and implement a strategic energy plan that reflects the vision of the adopted NWC Master Plan and the role of energy in its future. Program participation is intended to span 24 months with the initial 4-6 months dedicated to development of an actionable strategic energy action plan and the remaining time focused on the implementation of that plan.

The intent of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to confirm the City and County of Denver's intent to participate in the initial plan development phase of the Partners in Energy program and outline the commitment that the Mayor's Office of the National Western Center and Xcel Energy are making to this collaborative initiative. Based on a series of introductory meetings, this MOU outlines a custom approach to delivering Partners in Energy given the unique nature of the National Western Center redevelopment program goals and partnerships. The primary objective of this phase of the program is to develop an Energy Action Plan for the NWC, which will inform the "Energy" section of the campus' Regeneration Management Plan. Rather than a traditional Partners in Energy community energy plan, NWC's plan will be an inwardly focused, first order analysis and it will include recommendations for achieving net zero energy in order to inform the campus development program and design.

In order to achieve this Xcel Energy will provide:

 Collaborative public messaging of this Partners in Energy approach, including constructing or delivering an informational announcement regarding the partnership.

- Project management services helping the City and County of Denver (CCD) NWCO team to identify and convene a stakeholder group made up of NWC campus partners and relevant energy stakeholders and to integrate their technical expertise and resources into the NWC campus energy planning process. This would include regular project management meetings with CCD to monitor progress, as well as periodic communications with the stakeholder group throughout the planning process.
- Professional facilitation of two plan development work sessions with the stakeholder group to develop the energy plan's definition and boundaries of net zero energy, along with goals and strategies to accomplish this visions.
- Data analysis of community energy use and Xcel Energy program participation to the extent that it is legally and technically prudent and feasible. This can be used to identify potential opportunities to implement plan strategies. Xcel Energy will attempt to integrate data and modeling results provided by members of the stakeholder group in order to create a combined first-order energy and economic analysis to support the plan development. This may include convening a modeling sub-committee of the stakeholder planning team.
- Development of an NWC Energy Action Plan, which will inform the Energy portion of the NWC Regeneration Management Plan. The planning document, incorporating inputs from the stakeholder planning team, will be accessible to the community.
- Commitment to delivering an actionable and complete NWC energy action plan within four months of CCD and Xcel Energy signing this MOU.

Although participation in the Plan Development phase of Partners in Energy program requires no monetary contribution, the City and County of Denver, does agree to provide:

- A single contact point to work with recruiting stakeholders, coordinating planning meeting logistics, and coordinating distribution of deliverables.
- Meeting facilities to host the stakeholder group during development of the plan.
- Identification of existing plans or programs that could be leveraged or will need to be considered in successful development and delivery of this plan relative to the broader redevelopment plans of the National Western Center as well as city-wide goals and policies.
- Good-faith evaluation of the recommendations and analysis provided and fair consideration of the potential strategies and tactics identified

- that align with the National Western Center and City and County of Denver goals.
- Commitment to delivering an actionable and complete NWC Energy Action Plan within four months of CCD and Xcel Energy signing this MOU.
- The NWC Energy Action Plan and associated work products developed with the support of the Xcel Energy's Partners in Energy program work will be available to the public and Xcel Energy to share with other communities.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

National Western Center & Metro Wastewater Reclamation District Partnership

This memorandum of understanding ("MOU") is entered into this 23rd day of March 2017, between and among the National Western Center Executive Oversight Committee ("NWC-EOC"), (comprised of the City and County of Denver, Western Stock Show Association ("WSSA"), Colorado State University ("CSU") and a representative of the Globeville, Elyria and Swansea communities) and the Metro Wastewater Reclamation District ("MWRD"); herein after referred to as the "Parties".

The Parties agree to make their best efforts on a collaborative, non-binding basis to jointly work on the transformation of the National Western Stock Show Complex and Denver Coliseum into the National Western Center Campus, hereinafter referred to as the "NWC". Commensurate with the adopted NWC Master Plan, the Parties envision the NWC as a dynamic year-round campus, strategically aligning experiential education, research, economic development, the arts, and other entertainment uses to create the global destination for agricultural heritage and innovation. Nothing herein shall require either Party to enter into any agreements or commit to any funding or participation of funding of any project without further agreement and approval by the Parties' governing bodies, including but not limited to the MWRD Board of Directors, the CSU Board of Governors, and the WSSA Board of Directors.

The Parties agree that one of the key elements of realizing the NWC Master Plan vision is a collective commitment to the Guiding Principal to *Embrace an Ethic of Regeneration*, as defined in the Master Plan, and to build the NWC as a place to demonstrate innovative solutions to critical sustainability issues. The Parties also agree that achieving the NWC' district-scale regeneration goals related to energy, waste and water requires the development of a mutually agreeable design, programming and operating solution for the site. The Parties expect that there may be eventual agreement(s) between the Parties and/or other possible partners that articulate specific commitments related to design, construction, programming, operating, funding, and/or other details in order to fulfill the shared project objectives.

In furtherance of the elements of the NWC Master Plan, the Parties acknowledge the following:

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize and value the importance of a general statement related to regenerative development at NWC; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver has created the Office of the National Western Center ("NWCO") to oversee, strategically coordinate, and implement the NWC to help sustain the National Western Stock Show (NWSS) and to create connectivity between the local communities of Globeville, Elyria and Swansea through transportation systems and natural areas; and

WHEREAS, MWRD was formed in 1961 to serve the metro Denver region, currently treats the wastewater originating within a 715 square mile area and is committed to protecting the

environment and providing for the community's future needs. MWRD's mission is to protect the region's health and environment by cleaning water and recovering resources; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize that the WSSA, the parent organization that stages the NWSS each January, has existed for over one hundred years as a 501(c)3 charitable organization operating for the purposes of educating the general public regarding agriculture and related activities, promoting youth education and involvement in agriculture and the livestock industry, and providing a forum for an exchange of ideas by individuals in the agricultural industry, which includes the critical role water has and continues to play in the delivery of sustainable communities; and

WHEREAS, as Colorado's land-grant university, Colorado State University is committed to educational excellence and the University's mission directly corresponds with the outreach mission of the NWC to provide a community-centric, experiential, life-long learning opportunity in the heart of the City and County of Denver.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties commit to work together to advance the vision, mission and implementation of these shared objectives by undertaking the following design, construction, operating and facility programming planning efforts:

- The Parties intend to engage in those parts of the NWC planning and execution processes
 together and with other interested stakeholders that are related to topics relevant to their
 missions, including regeneration, campus wastewater infrastructure design and build-out,
 beneficial use of wastewater byproducts including heat recovery and opportunities for
 collaborative research.
- 2. The Parties intend to engage in the development of a technical alternatives analysis considering optimal long-term configuration of wastewater infrastructure in the vicinity of the NWC site, as well as a phasing approach that meets both the operational needs of MWRD as well as the near-term NWC construction schedule. The Parties agree that the geographic scope of this analysis will likely extend outside of NWC boundaries. The purpose of this analysis is to inform overall NWC infrastructure design and construction (including the South Platte riverfront) and to inform opportunities for beneficial use of wastewater byproducts (such as heat, water and natural gas) at the NWC. Notwithstanding the foregoing, however, nothing in this MOU shall be interpreted to grant any approval required of MWRD for any selected alternative or beneficial use of any wastewater byproduct without further agreement and or approval of applicable governing bodies.
- 3. As related to the programming of the NWC, the Parties agree to seek opportunities to create a nexus of research and education among experts within the water treatment and distribution, wastewater and agriculture industries, with the goal of developing a truly unique educational and research campus. The resultant effort will serve as a model for

state, national and international regeneration and agribusiness stakeholders. Programming components may include, but are not limited to:

- a. Hands-on environmental education
- b. K-12 educational programs and resources
- c. Research, development and demonstration of new innovations in the urban water infrastructure realm including emerging wastewater technologies
- d. Research and teaching lab space
- e. Co-working/shared space to foster collaboration
- f. Water treatment testing with multiple sources of water for research purposes
- 4. This Memorandum of Understanding sets forth the intent of the signatories hereto. It is not a legally binding document, and it is not intended to confer remedies on any party in the event of its breach. All contracts or other written instruments requiring the assent of the City and County of Denver must be subscribed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties hereby approve the terms outlined above.
