

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CSU UPDATE



House Bill 15-1344 Process

Funding stream is separate from all other higher education requests, allocated by House Bill 15-1344

Process for Each CSU Facility:

- Program Plans including cost estimate created
- Program Plan moves through usual steps for state approval
- If approved, included in the Governor's Annual Budget and approved by legislature



CSU UPDATE



Coordination with overall NWC program

- CSU will purchase pad-ready sites for CSU facilities
- Design standards for CSU facilities will follow site-wide standards
- CSU researchers will look for opportunities to use the full site as a "living lab" in collaboration with NWCA and partners
- CSU facilities will interact with public realm as determined via Placemaking



NWC Program Baseline Book

The official document for the inclusive scope, schedule and budget for a program

Scope: A detailed description of the facilities, infrastructure and services to be built.

Schedule: When we plan to do the scope items.

Budget: The maximum amount of money that we have to spend on the things we will build or do during the time we plan to do it.

It will inform all capital build procurements




