<ul> <li>Thanks for all the comments on the stock show. Tykus and staff were incredibly helpful with setting up for stock show. Appreciate NWCO and Authority.</li> <li>Attendance was around 586,000. This was incredible given that Omicron was at 30%. We were not 18% down in revenues. We had good concession and ticket sales numbers. Rodeo was strong. Our grounds admission was low.</li> <li>Coors Art set a record, Grand champion sold for \$160,000 Jr. Livestock auctions netted an all-time record for animals.</li> <li>AE drove into the neighborhoods to bring neighbors into the event – she brought 1200 people into the show. She flyered everywhere.</li> <li>Health of workers was good.</li> <li>The yards were celebrated - exhibitors were excited.</li> <li>We got 4 new sales coming next year due to word-of-mouth</li> <li>Lots of successes.</li> <li>Round up  <ul> <li>Explained that there was difficulty in getting Round up.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>		

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- KM was incentivizing employees to do Round up –
   they tried, but they had a difficult time training staff.

#### **Questions:**

**John**: I understand about the short staffing for Round Up. This was a good explanation for a difficult year.

**Brendan**: a suggestion when evaluating for next year. I know some organizations that build in a round -up with the ability to opt out. You might consider that.

Lucia: We need to work more closely with the CIF group. We need the report for them. I think this goes back to something the community members said from the beginning. They have emphasized that this is not the best source of revenue. There need to be other sources. We are going to work hard with Jurassic to have better numbers. CIF is asking for a percentage – we are going to collect data so we know where the best sources are.

**John**: we need to make the point that this is not the only source.

**Robb**: I think the numbers you got were good – we can demonstrate within our control. I have a problem with the zero. I agree that the community should not expect it to be the end all be all. Doesn't sit well with me.

**Jones**: commented on the boot shine business. We are not seeing the usual Denver customers.

**McCarthy**: I am guessing you are being aggressive about bringing the breeds back.

**Paul:** We are working hard to bring them back – are building bridges. Exhibitors want to come back. Angus and Hereford carry the weight and the other breeds follow.
