






THE NATIONAL WESTERN CENTER AUTHORITY

- Nonprofit organization responsible for operating, maintaining, programming and promoting the National Western Center.
- Primary entity responsible for ensuring the National Western Center achieves its mission.
- Formed in 2018
- Responsible for developing a Community Investment Fund (CIF) benefiting the Globeville, Elyria and Swansea neighborhoods

PROPOSED SEQUENCE FOR PROCUREMENT
